#### **APPROVAL OF MINUTES – October 5, 2018**

Mayor Pulice moved and Mr. Ryan seconded the motion to approve the October 5, 2018 ONCC meeting minutes. The members approved the minutes by unanimous voice vote.

#### **Presentation – FAA Research on Aviation Noise**

Mayor Juracek introduced Rebecca (Becky) Cointin the FAA noise division manager at the agency's Office of Environment and Energy. Ms. Cointin develops, recommends, and coordinates national aviation policy relating to aviation noise. Specifically, she oversees a research and development program on aviation noise impacts, noise certification, and noise mitigation. Ms. Cointin serves as a "Working Group Co-Rapporteur" on noise technical issues

under the International Civil Aviation Organization (ICAO) Committee on Aviation Environmental Protection (CAEP).

Ms. Cointin said her division looks at community noise from aircraft – all noise sources contribute to acoustic signature – both at takeoff and during landing – aircraft noise, landing takeoff cycle and community exposure. She said that a lot of the research on aircraft noise is from the 1970s. In the 1970s, there were fewer aircraft operations, but the aircraft were much louder. Her division addresses the noise challenge through three categories – understanding the impact of noise, outreach and mitigation.

She discussed FAA Aircraft Noise Impact Research, and highlighted several areas of study including Community Annoyance, Children's Learning, Sleep Disturbance and Health Impacts. Noise outreach efforts that they are currently focusing on include community outreach, noise complaint initiatives, examining ways to more efficiently and effectively address noise complaints, and ways to increase public understanding. She directed members to [Faa.gov/go/aviation noise](http://Faa.gov/go/aviation%20noise) and NoiseQuest websites.

She also reported on the following:

Sound insulation research – working on elements not yet well investigated by previous research. They have developed recommended practices to support acoustic testing, and are looking to create international standard setting.

CLEEN – Continuous Lower Energy, Emissions and Noise is a public private 50-50 cost share partnership. The program's aim is to reduce fuel burn, emissions and noise via aircraft and engine technologies and alternative jet fuels. Reduction at the source some of the most beneficial ways to provide noise reduction, but this takes time to implement through the fleet. CLEEN also is looking at how an aircraft flies – aircraft operations and changing how aircraft are flown to reduce noise.

FAA Reauthorization – a five-year reauthorization was signed into law October 5. Multiple sections address aircraft noise including: looking at alternative metric evaluation, report on aircraft noise mitigation and safety study and more. FAA is still reviewing details and anticipates looking at the altering scope of existing research with plans to expand how it looks at other impacts possibly at an accelerated schedule.

### **Chicago Department of Aviation New Team Members**

Mayor Juracek introduced a new CDA team member, Ms. Nancy Kiernan who will be working with ONCC in addition to many other roles for the aviation department.

Ms. Kiernan is the assistant commissioner of intergovernmental affairs, who has a 29-year background in planning and development. She will be focusing on the major planning and regulatory efforts that will be crucial in the implementation of O'Hare's terminal expansion. Nancy will lead the coordination of environmental and intergovernmental affairs pertaining to the capital projects for both airports, including coordination with a multitude of city and state agencies, such as ISHTA, IDOT, MWRD, as well as surrounding municipalities. She will also coordinate noise and environment planning for the department; including the Residential Sound Insulation programs, as well as staffing the two noise commission CDA seats on: O'Hare Noise Compatibility Commission (ONCC) and the Midway Noise Compatibility Commission (MNCC). Nancy has worked in the private sector and in the municipal arena where she has served as a special projects manager coordinating many key infrastructure, neighborhood, commercial and industrial developments throughout the city of Chicago.

Ms. Kiernan provided an update on the Residential Sound Insulation Program odorous windows situation, stating that two reports had been issued indicating that the source of the odor was PVC coating on the screens, and it was not found to have any health impacts. CDA is in the process of evaluating solutions to the problem. CDA is in the process of developing a detailed

plan for addressing current issues, as well as reviewing and revising specifications used to purchase windows, and will ensure that customer service is the first and foremost ethic of this program.

### **Report of the Chicago Department of Aviation September 2018 ANMS Report**

Mr. Anderson reported on the September 2018 ANMS Report. The total number of aircraft operations for September was 73,613. The most used departure runway was 9R (31%); the most used arrival runway was 10C (25%). Total complaints were 32,307.

### **Report of the Chair – Mayor Arlene A. Juracek FASA/ONCC Leadership Meeting**

Chairman Juracek reported regular meetings between the FAA and ONCC Leadership will continue to reinforce an ongoing dialog, and be kept in the loop on the environmental review of the Interim Fly Quiet proposal currently before the FAA for review.

### **AAAE/ACI Conference Recap**

Mayor Juracek reported that she and Fly Quiet Committee Vice-Chair Karyn Robles attended the AAAE/ACI Conference, which brought together industry experts, airports and airlines. Ms. Robles shared that it was a beneficial conference and emphasized there is no solution that works for all airports.

### **FAA Correspondence**

Chairman Juracek referenced correspondence from the FAA regarding Metroplex concept. The O'Hare airspace and how they impact noise and the decisions of pilots and controllers. She reported that she wrote a letter to FAA Regional Administrator Rebecca McPherson requesting an explanation of the integrated O'Hare airspace, the term Metroplex and the explanation why O'Hare is not listed as the FAA's 11 designated Metroplex airports. A copy of the correspondence was provided in the meeting packets.

### **Report of the ONCC Technical Committee – Ms. Catherine Dunlap, Chair**

Committee Chair Dunlap reported that Vice-Chair Dennis Ryan was working with Ryan Anderson to develop additional educational sessions for ONCC members. Noise 201 will be held in November 13, 2018 and Airport 201 will be held in January 15, 2019. The next meeting is scheduled for November 13, 2018 at 9:30 am at the Mount Prospect Village Hall.

### **Report of the ONCC Fly Quiet Committee – Mr. Joseph Annunzio, Chair**

Committee Chair Annunzio reported The Fly Quiet Committee met on October 18, 2018. At that meeting, he asked members to look at the criteria plan and recommend modifications of it for the next meeting. He said he believes a modified plan would be the direction to take when submitting the information to the FAA. It was his hope that the committee members could come up with multiple plans in preparation for what is coming soon. He requested that all submissions be sent to Jeanette Camacho no later than November 6, 2018 in preparation for the November meeting.

CDA consultants presented several handouts, the first was the North American Airport Traffic Summary a comparison of operations and number of runways at major US airports. At full build out, O'Hare will have the most runways at eight. The CDA has submitted questions on ONCC's behalf to the FAA for clarification. The Committee reviewed some of the answers and are awaiting answers to other questions. The Committee also reviewed the estimated runway utilization at full build out, which didn't take into consideration the use of the north and south runways because the FAA didn't contemplate changing the Fly Quiet. The EIS statement states ONCC would consider implementing any changes to the existing Fly Quiet Program.

The next Fly Quiet Committee meets on Thursday, November 15, 2018 at 9:30 a.m. at the CDA

building.
