### **APPROVAL OF MEETING MINUTES – November 13, 2018**

**Mr. Ryan moved**, and **Ms. Robles** seconded a motion to approve the November 13, 2018 ONCC Technical Committee meeting minutes. The motion was approved by a unanimous voice vote.

Committee Chair Catherine Dunlap announced that Mr. Ernie Kosower, Park Ridge alternate, is the permanent representative on the Technical Committee

## **Chicago 311 Modernization System Discussion**

Committee Chair Dunlap acknowledged set backs in the recently launched Chicago 311 Modernization System. She said the committee will continue to provide input to staff for improvements. She said that there maybe a need for a separate system for noise complaints.

Mayor Juracek said residents outside of the Chicago area are not able to file complaints on the new system.

Mr. Frame reported the City is working hard to tweak the system before looking at an “off the shelf” product. He said the City is working hard to make this system the best possible.

Ms. Kiernan said the City continues to test after the system went live. IT put together the technology to get where it wanted to be. She said they have a good handle on the situation. The City is working with the IT team we will get to where we need to be.

Ms. Kiernan said it is was on the City’s number one priority list and they expect to hear back today how it is going.

Mayor Juracek asked if the anonymous calls will have identity by zip code, not addresses.

Ms. Kiernan said the system needs the address to know where the complaint is coming from for the system to do what it does.

Alderman Woods said the suburbs are being shut out of the system. He said that this is a huge oversight. He asked when it would get fixed. He said people will begin to complain.

Ms. Kiernan said the City of Chicago is having a problem working through the system. They have been talking all week, and hope to have answers by today. It does not appear to have an instant fix, but it will get done.

Mr. Ryan said maybe if we want anonymity, we ask for the closest intersection.

Ms. Kiernan said this was the first time she had heard that question, she would ask.

Mayor Juracek said she understood the City 311 was trying to do to create a longitudinal system but hoped that the noise complaint reporting is at the highest priority.

Committee Chair Dunlap said that at the close of the August meeting the committee felt anonymity was important and we were looking for a way to provide a general geographic location.

Ms. Kiernan said the first step is to refine the existing system before we develop additional variations. She said that in terms of GIS that is what we are working on right now. She said the City is committed to make progress on what works for our purposes and those that want to find out.

## **IFQ Update: Government shutdown/no report from the FAA**

Committee Chair Dunlap reported the draft document was released yesterday and it is on the FAA website.

Mr. Annunzio said ONCC members need to be present at the workshops.

Mr. Frame said the document will be on the website until February 27, 2019.

Mr. Summers ask what people should expect at the workshops.

Committee Chair Dunlap explained the procedures and said the ONCC would be in the lobby along with a registration table. There will be informational boards set up on easels in the large banquet rooms. Visitors will walk through the room where there would be consultants to answer questions and explain the maps and text. There will be informational stations. FAA staff will also be available.

Mayor Juracek stated that there will also be court reporters available to record resident comments and take testimony.

Mr. Frame explained residents can interact with FAA staff and consultants. The workshops will last for four days and last from 2p.m. until 8 p.m. The workshops are placed in the middle of the 45-day comment period.

Committee Chair Dunlap asked if the public library has a summary with a thumb drive for viewing.

Mr. Frame said he would verify what was being sent to the main library in Chicago

### **Noise Monitor Report**

Ms. Celik reported that the department was all caught up with deployments. The long-term monitor report for Ward 39 showed an average of noise level of 59.6 for the month of November.

Committee Chair Dunlap encouraged members to request portable monitors, as they are available.

### **Airport 201 Presentation**

Mr. Ryan Anderson of Landrum and Brown gave his final presentation in a series of four reports that focused on aircraft noise (Noise 101 and 201) and airports (Airport 101 and 201). The topics of this presentation include: Runway Geometry; Airport Signage, Markings and Lighting; Imaginary Surfaces; Navigational Aids; Airport Diagram; Airport Inspections; and System Example. All four reports are on the ONCC website.

The Technical Committee chair reviewed the work plan for the upcoming year.

### **Comments from the Audience**

Mr. Dan Dwyer, unincorporated Medinah, said he was disappointed with the Modernized 311 system that would not take advantage of GIS capability and thought it was a missed opportunity.

**Mayor Juracek** made a motion to adjourn the meeting. The motion was seconded by **Mr. Summers**.
